WOMAN #1 Oh, please!

(MAN #1 is hysterical)

WOMAN #1 What's wrong with you?

MAN #1

Listen, it's almost closing time and we still haven't taped the windows and bought provisions.

WOMAN #1

Bought provisions. Lord! You are totally out of whack!

MAN #1

On the news they said to take the warnings really seriously!

WOMAN #1

Nothing is going to happen to Bay Ridge. It's a ridge! We can't get flooded and we don't have trees close to our house.

MAN #1
